Lydiard Millicent CE VC Primary School, Wiltshire

Lydiard Millicent School was built in 1846 when 42 children were taught. Throughout the last 160 years, the school has been rebuilt and extended to now have 209 pupils on roll. The Lydiard Millicent Church of England Voluntary Controlled School serves the village of Lydiard Millicent and the outlying hamlets of Greenhill, Greatfield and Hook.



When Paula Brannigan, ICT Subject Leader, saw ActivExpression learner response systems being demonstrated at the Birmingham NEC Education Show last year, she was impressed. The school purchased their 1st kit for the Year 6 class. When Mrs. Dougill, Headteacher, spotted them in action during an assembly, she immediately wanted to implement them into the whole of KS2. Paul Brazier, Education Consultant for LEB visited Mrs. Dougill and the Year 5 teacher to discuss the role-out into KS2 and the support training session that LEB Partnership offer. Immediately after the meeting, the Year 4 and Year 5 teachers implemented ActivExpression into their classes.



As well as being able to use the data to assess pupils' performance, ActivExpression has also been used during SATs revision, assemblies and even Parent's evenings! Teachers at Lydiard Millicent have found that the handsets are great for getting the pupils immediate attention, self assessment and feedback on what they feel they have learnt from the days' lesson.
