



# ActivExpression in Newham

***In March 2009, Sandringham Primary School in Newham volunteered to take part in an ActivExpression Pilot Project.***

ActivExpression allows students to individually respond to questions set by the teacher with words, phrases, sentences or numeric input. It helps to improve participation, interaction, motivation, concentration and individual pupil voice. It can meet the individual learning needs of each student whilst still in a group environment and will provide detailed feedback on the class and individual students for the teacher to review.
